#### **Item No. 1 – Health Insurance Contributions**

Director of Administrative Services Tom Dankert stated the City of Austin switched from a self-insured program to a PEIP program in 2019. He stated as part of the HRA/HSA plan, the City is required to contribute \$750 for single coverage or \$1,500 for family coverage annually to an account. City staff recently discovered that the contributions were being paid out of the employee's premiums, thereby overcharging the employees. Mr. Dankert proposed that the City refund the overcharged amount to the employees and adopt a new resolution with the corrected insurance premiums.

Moved by Council Member-at-Large Austin, seconded by Council Member Waller, approving a refund of overpayment for health insurance premiums. Carried.

#### <u>Item No. 2 – Single Point Intersection Video</u>

Public Works Director Steven Lang provided a video with information on the single point intersection proposed on the 14<sup>th</sup> Street NW bridge.

### <u>Item No. 3 – County Road 46 Reconstruction</u>

Public Works Director Steven Lang stated that Mower County is planning the reconstruction of County Road 46 from 28<sup>th</sup> Street NE to Hwy 56. The project will take two years, with year one being the bridge replacement and the second year being the roadway reconstruction.
