Mayor Stiehm called the meeting to order at 5:30 p.m.

Moved by Council Member King, seconded by Council Member Austin, approving the agenda. Carried.

Moved by Council Member King, seconded by Council Member Fischer, approving the Council minutes from June 18, 2018. Carried.

#### **PUBLIC HEARINGS:**

A public hearing was held for a tax abatement request from Sean Selmecki/Midwest Cabinetry & Millwork, LLC. The company plans to build a home at 1905 13<sup>th</sup> Avenue NE and are requesting a five-year tax abatement in the approximate amount of \$7,475.

There were no public comments.

Moved by Council Member King, seconded by Council Member Austin, approving a tax abatement application for Sean Selmecki / Midwest Cabinetry. Carried 5-0.

#### BID OPENING AND AWARD:

The City received the following bids for Oakland Place & 12<sup>th</sup> Street SE pedestrian improvements:

Mr. Lang stated work will consist of the installation of a rapid flashing beacon system and pedestrian ramp improvements. The Hormel Foundation provided a grant in the amount of \$14,000 for the project and the City will fund the remaining balance.

Moved by Council Member-at-Large Anderson, seconded by Council Member Fischer, adopting a resolution awarding a bid for Oakland Place & 12<sup>th</sup> Street SE pedestrian improvements to Gary Groh Construction, LLC. Carried 5-0.

### PETITIONS AND REQUESTS:

Moved by Council Member Austin, seconded by Council Member King, adopting a resolution Approving the carryover of funds from 2017 – budget adjustment #2. Carried 5-0.

Public Works Director Steven Lang requested the Council approve additional engineering services on the Turtle Creek flood control project. The City has been working with Bolton & Menk since 2013 for the design of a flood levee and received additional comments from FEMA and the MnDNR which has resulted in additional project costs of \$46,390.

Moved by Council Member King, seconded by Council Member Austin, adopting a resolution approving additional engineering services on the Turtle Creek Flood Control Project. Carried 5-0.

Public Works Director Steven Lang requested the Council approve additional engineering services on Phase 1 of the North Main Street Flood control project. The City previously approved a contract with SEH in the fall of 2014 for the design of the project. Additional work must be completed due to changes on the proposed recreation center project. Mr. Lang requested the Council approve additional services in the amount of \$29,900.

Moved by Council Member-at-Large Anderson, seconded by Council Member Austin, adopting a resolution approving additional engineering services on the North Main Street Flood Control Project, Phase 1. Carried 5-0.

Public Works Director Steven Lang requested the Council approve a grant application for the Turtle Creek Flood Mitigation Project. Mr. Lang stated the legislature recently allocated \$1,200,000 for the project that that would be added to an existing grant in the amount of \$1,150,000 and matched by LOST funds in the amount of \$2,350,000.

Moved by Council Member Austin, seconded by Council Member King, approving a grant application for the Turtle Creek Flood mitigation project. Carried 5-0.

Moved by Council Member King, seconded by Council Member Austin, approving a gambling premises application for the Fraternal Order of the Eagles #703 at the Angry Hog Brewery and Taproom. Carried 5-0.

Mayor Stiehm noted the property at  $816\ 11^{th}$  Avenue SW had been cleaned up and therefore could be removed from the agenda.

Moved by Council Member King, seconded by Council Member Austin, granting the Planning and Zoning Department the power to contract for the removal of junk and/or illegally stored vehicles at 507 Main Street South, Ramero Property. Carried.

Moved by Council Member King, seconded by Council Member Austin, granting the Planning and Zoning Department the power to contract for the removal of junk and/or illegally stored vehicles at 1103 21<sup>st</sup> Avenue SW, JP Morgan Property. Carried.

Police Captain Dave McKichan stated the Council can adopt an ordinance to allow these vehicles on the roads if it wishes to do so.

Mayor Stiehm stated City staff would research the topic and bring it back to the Council for consideration.
