Public Works Director Steven Lang stated work will consist of the demolition of a 177'x 229' building consisting of lumber framework, pipework, concrete piers, 3" clean filter rock, concrete floor, precast concrete wall panels and concrete vent/access tunnel. Alternate bids were also taken for cast-in-place concrete wall removal on the north, east and south sides along with an alternate for removal of the cast-in-place west wall.
