# PETITIONS AND REQUESTS

Director of Administrative Services Tom Dankert requested the Council designate depositories for checking and investment of public funds.

Moved by Council Member Baskin, seconded by Council Member Fischer, adopting a resolution designating depositories for checking and investment of public funds for 2020. Carried 6-0.

Director of Administrative Services Tom Dankert requested the Council approve the official newspaper for 2020. The Austin Daily Herald is the official legal newspaper and is increasing their rate from \$4.61 per inch to \$5.07 per inch.

Moved by Council Member Fischer, seconded by Council Member King, designating the official newspaper for 2020. Carried.

Assistant City Engineer Mitch Wenum presented a feasibility report to Council for the 10<sup>th</sup> Street NE (Oakland Pl SE to 2<sup>nd</sup> Ave NE) and 4<sup>th</sup> Street SW (Oakland Ave W to 1<sup>st</sup> Ave SW) street construction project. He stated the project is feasible and will have a total cost of \$1,275,000. Mr. Wenum reviewed the project and requested a public hearing be held for the improvement on February 18, 2020.

Moved by Council Member King, seconded by Council Member Waller, adopting a resolution receiving feasibility report and calling for a public hearing on February 18, 2020 for street improvements on 10<sup>th</sup> Street NE (Oakland Pl SE to 2<sup>nd</sup> Ave NE) and 4<sup>th</sup> Street SW (Oakland Ave W to 1<sup>st</sup> Ave SW). Carried 6-0.

Assistant City Engineer Mitch Wenum presented a feasibility report to Council for the 5<sup>th</sup> Street SW (1<sup>st</sup> Ave SW to 5<sup>th</sup> Ave SW), 6<sup>th</sup> Avenue SW (4<sup>th</sup> St SW to 6<sup>th</sup> St SW) and 7<sup>th</sup> Street SW (4<sup>th</sup> Ave SW to 5<sup>th</sup> Ave SW) street construction project. He stated the project is feasible and will have a total cost of \$900,000. Mr. Wenum reviewed the project and requested a public hearing be held for the improvement on February 18, 2020.

Moved by Council Member King, seconded by Council Member Fischer, adopting a resolution receiving feasibility report and calling for a public hearing on February 18, 2020 for street improvements on 5<sup>th</sup> Street SW (1<sup>st</sup> Ave SW to 5<sup>th</sup> Ave SW), 6<sup>th</sup> Avenue SW (4<sup>th</sup> St SW to 6<sup>th</sup> St SW) and 7<sup>th</sup> Street SW (4<sup>th</sup> Ave SW to 5<sup>th</sup> Ave SW.) Carried 6-0.

Assistant City Engineer Mitch Wenum presented a feasibility report to Council for the 5<sup>th</sup> Avenue NE (Oakland Pl NE to 19<sup>th</sup> St NE) street construction project. He stated the project is feasible and will have a total cost of \$600,000. Mr. Wenum reviewed the project and requested a public hearing be held for the improvement on February 18, 2020.

Moved by Council Member King, seconded by Council Member Helle, adopting a resolution receiving feasibility report and calling for a public hearing on February 18, 2020 for street improvements on 5<sup>th</sup> Avenue NE (Oakland Pl NE to 19<sup>th</sup> St NE.) Carried 6-0.

Assistant City Engineer Mitch Wenum presented a feasibility report to Council for the 7<sup>th</sup> Street NW (8<sup>th</sup> Ave NW to 13<sup>th</sup> Ave NW) and 9<sup>th</sup> Avenue NW (4<sup>th</sup> St NW to 8<sup>th</sup> St NW) street construction project. He stated the project is feasible and will have a total cost of \$1,225,000. Mr. Wenum reviewed the project and requested a public hearing be held for the improvement on February 18, 2020.

Moved by Council Member Fischer, seconded by Council Member Waller, adopting a resolution receiving feasibility report and calling for a public hearing on February 18, 2020 for street improvements on 7<sup>th</sup> Street NW (8<sup>th</sup> Ave NW to 13<sup>th</sup> Ave NW) and 9<sup>th</sup> Avenue NW (4<sup>th</sup> St NW to 8<sup>th</sup> St NW). Carried 6-0.

Assistant City Engineer Mitch Wenum presented a feasibility report to Council for sidewalk extension on 4<sup>th</sup> Avenue NW from 12<sup>th</sup> St NW to 14<sup>th</sup> St NW street construction project. He stated the project is feasible and will have a total cost of \$50,000. Mr. Wenum reviewed the project and requested a public hearing be held for the improvement on May 4, 2020 instead of February 18, 2020 for this project.

Moved by Council Member King, seconded by Council Member Helle, adopting a resolution receiving feasibility report and calling for a public hearing on May 4, 2020 sidewalk extension from 12<sup>th</sup> St NW to 14<sup>th</sup> St NW on 4<sup>th</sup> Avenue NW. Carried 6-0.

Public Works Director Steven Lang requested the Council request a variance from Rule 6 of the Cedar River Watershed District for a proposed flood mitigation project at the Waste Water Treatment Plan. Rule 6 states that flood plain area shall not be removed which would cause a net decrease in flood water storage. Mr. Lang stated that the area proposed to be removed is protected by an unaccredited levee system and the area has never been allowed to flood in the past so it has not been used as flood water storage. The City is proposing at \$78 million expansion of the Waste Water Treatment Plant and would like to also complete a flood levee project to protect this important infrastructure.

Council Member Baskin asked what happens if the variance is not granted.

Mr. Lang stated the City has been working on the project with the Cedar River Watershed district for a couple of years and they have expressed support for the project but if the project is not approved then the construction of the new Waste Water Treatment Plant would need to be moved to a new site.

Moved by Council Member-at-Large Austin, seconded by Council Member King, requesting a variance from the Cedar River Watershed District, Rule 6 for the Waste Water Treatment Plant Flood Mitigation Project. Carried.

Public Works Director Steven Lang requested the Council request a variance from Rule 6 of the Cedar River Watershed District for a proposed housing project on 6<sup>th</sup> Street NE. Rule 6 states that flood plain area shall not be removed which would cause a net decrease in flood water storage. Mr. Lang stated that the area proposed to be removed is currently protected by levee and hasn't been used for flood plain storage since 2008.

Moved by Council Member Fischer, seconded by Council Member King, requesting a variance from the Cedar River Watershed District, Rule 6 for the Riverview Project. Carried.

Public Works Director Steven Lang requested the Council approve an individual control mechanism with WCI Austin Landfill, LLC. The agreement sets forth the parameters for leachate being accepted from the landfill.

Moved by Council Member-at-Large Austin, seconded by Council Member King, adopting a resolution approving an individual control mechanism agreement with WCI Austin Landfill, LLC. Carried 6-0.

Moved by Council Member Baskin, seconded by Council Member King, adopting a resolution accepting donations to the City of Austin. Carried 6-0.

Moved by Council Member King, seconded by Council Member Baskin, adopting a resolution declaring the property at 1303 Oakland Avenue East as hazardous. Carried 6-0.
